






Secondary Hub Autumn Term 2019

Following on from three successful Secondary Hub events hosted by Stockton Sixth Form College, this year we are venturing into new FE and HE environments. Bede Sixth Form College kindly agreed to host the Autumn term event and in the Summer term we will be visiting Teesside University.

The session started with a Pupil Voice activity led by colleagues from Health. Pupils were asked to think and talk about their experiences of the Annual Medical Reviews. Views were collected and will be fed back to Harrowgate Health Trust.





The session then moved into the Sports Centre where pupils were involved in using the climbing wall and some team building activities. Pupils were fully engaged throughout the session and really
